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Grade 3 Book Project Choice Board

Students will need to choose two boxes to complete their novel readings. Each written project should be 3/4 of a page or longer.

Book Cover Create a book cover for the book you read. Make sure it looks different from the actual book cover. On the front include the title, author, illustrator, and a picture. On the back include the setting,	Comic Strip Create a comic strip showing 5 major events from the book in sequence. Include captions and /or dialogue bubbles to retell the story along with pictures.	Friendly Letter Write a one page to a friend recommending your book. Tell your friend what the book was about and why you would recommend it. Make sure you include the title, author, characters, and setting.
