
# Choose a Livestream...

Know that your priest is offering Mass and praying for your family today. See if your parish is live-streaming Mass!

There will also be a special Mass for Kids offered this weekend by Fr. Andy Davy. As a family, choose which Mass you will attend and, if possible, join in LIVE.

# Make it Special

There are so many ways to honor God and to enter more fully into Mass as a family. Here are a few suggestions to consider:



- Make an Altar: take an end table and spread a white cloth over it. Place around it a crucifix - or pictures of Jesus, Mary, or the saints. Prop your phone or tablet up on your altar as you stream Mass.
- **Opening Hymn:** before the live stream begins, ask your family to be still and to quiet themselves... Play the song below.
- **Sit, Stand, & Kneel:** follow along with Mass. Sit for the readings, stand for the Gospel, and kneel after the "Holy, holy, holy."
- Plan a Celebration: every Mass IS a celebration because we get to receive Jesus and his Divine Life within us - but consider planning a big breakfast after Mass or something creative!

# A Great Way to Pray

Parents, follow this 4-step process and invite your family to recognize God's presence, to use their imagination, and to enter into the passage of scripture below.



### Read

# Read the passage out loud. Listen to God's spoken word, and then share with your family:

- What do you notice?
- What words, phrases, or images stand out?

# Reflect

# Silently reflect upon what stood out to you. Start with the first word, image or phrase.

- · What comes up?
- What are you experiencing?
- What might God be saying to you?

# Respond

# Share with Jesus what you were just thinking about and everything you experienced.

- Tell Jesus what is on your heart.
- Ask questions and ask for what you need.

### Rest

# Rest, worship Him, spend some time receiving what He wants to give, and if there's time, go to another word or phrase.

Take what God has given you, & recall it throughout the day.

## **Parent**

"As I read this passage, imagine that you are there at the raising of Lazarus. Hear, feel, and see what is going on. Look around and be a part of the story! Open your heart and your mind to wherever your imagination takes you and whatever Jesus wants to share with you. Close your eyes, breathe and try to place yourself in the story."

# Parent or Reader

Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?" So they took away the stone. And Jesus raised his eyes and said, "Father, I thank you for hearing me. I know that you always hear me; but because of the crowd here I have said this, that they may believe that you sent me." And when he had said this, He cried out in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out, tied hand and foot with burial bands, and his face was wrapped in a cloth. So Jesus said to them, "Untie him and let him go."



# Free Family Fun - "Unpack It!"

Create teams. Grab a backpack or gym bag and pack it full of as many clothing items as you can. Each bag must contain the same number of items. Be creative!

# The Challenge

Select one member from each team and swap backpacks. On "Go," selected team members must put on all of the items found in the backpack. First person to do it WINS! Take turns and have fun! What is the time to beat!?

# Unpack It (Each person gets to share)

- · What were the challenges in this game?
- What did you like? Not like?
- Was it easy to move with all of those clothes on?
- How did it feel to be 'freed' of all those clothes?
- How does this game remind you of today's Gospel reading about Lazarus?

# **Dinner Discussion**

(As you ask some or all of the following questions, give your family the time to respond. We would recommend you read the parent tips to the right.)

From today's Gospel we heard, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." Jesus, Lazarus, Mary and Martha were close friends. Jesus was not physically with them during this important time...

- Which friends have you missed being with this week? Why?
- How have you reached out to your friends?
  How is this different than being in person with them?
- We can't physically be present at Mass or Adoration with Jesus. As a family, what are some ways we can connect with Jesus this week?
- How will these help us feel Jesus' Presence?
- Which one(s) will we commit to do this week?



# Parent Tip: CARE

Perhaps your children have been invited to share more deeply and there is much going on right now.


- C: Create a 'safe place' for teens to share in the home.
- A: Acknowledge the feelings that your kids are experiencing (hope, sadness, fear, anxiety)
- R: Remind teens that they are not alone- family members will help one another together.
- E: Encourage and invite all questions with compassion and care.
