History

All Saints Catholic Academy (ASCA) is a regional school serving three founding parishes and several supporting parishes. The school was established in 2005 as the first new school in the Joliet Diocese in 43 years. The school opened on August 24, 2005 with 288 students.

ASCA is currently governed at the local level by an Executive Committee comprised of the pastors of the sponsoring parishes and is advised by the Superintendent of Catholic Schools. One pastor functions as the Pastoral President of the Executive Committee, serving a two-year term and then the role rotates to another sponsoring parish pastor.

The Board of Trustees (BOT) is comprised of the pastors of the sponsoring parishes, and at least two members from each sponsoring parish, appointed by the pastor, and serving three year terms. The School Board President and Principal serve as ex-officio members of the Board of Trustees.

The School Board is comprised of three members from each sponsoring parish and one member from each supporting parish and five ex-officio members: Pastoral President, the Principal, the School Home Parish Partnership (SHPP), the All Saints Athletic Association (ASAA), and the BOT President. (ASCA Board of Trustee Governance Model by-laws, revised and approved 6/14/11)

The Principal is responsible for all administrative matters in the school and oversees the supervision of students, staff, programs, and facilities.

The regional model was designed over a seven-year period prior to opening of the school through the hard work and dedication of the pastors and parishioners of the three founding parishes.

The school is centered around four academies: Early Childhood Academy (preschool), Primary Academy (K-2), Intermediate Academy (3-5), and Junior High Academy (6-8). Each academy has developmentally appropriate expectations for behavior and academic rigor.

The school also implemented a unique design element from its founding. All Saints Catholic Academy has an extended school day (8:00am-3:30pm).



About




Strategic Planning Background & Process

Following the school's initial start-up, formal strategic plans were completed in 2009 and 2014 under the guidance of the founding Principal. The founding Principal retired in 2016, and a nationwide search was conducted to hire a new Principal.

In 2016, coinciding with the hire of the new Principal, the Board of Trustees commenced a planning process to develop a new strategic plan during the 2016-2017 school year in an effort to create a document and plan for the next five years of the school's life cycle. A cross-functional committee was developed to lead the planning process including the current Pastoral President, Principal, representatives from each of the founding parishes, supporting parishes, teachers, staff, and parents. An external facilitator was chosen to lead the process to ensure a comprehensive, objective, and inclusive plan. The external facilitator is a professor at a local Catholic university with demonstrated experience in leading strategic planning efforts for Catholic schools in the Joliet Diocese.

The planning process was designed and implemented in four phases:



The 2016-2017 Strategic Planning process included:

- Review of background data internally and externally
- Review of pertinent historical and current documents
- Development of a guiding cross-functional and representative strategic planning committee including members and representatives from:
 - Pastoral Executive Committee (Pastoral President)
 - Board of Trustees
 - School Board
 - o Principal
 - Teachers
 - o Athletic Director (ASAA)
 - o Parents (Current Parents, Founding Parents, Alumni Parents)
 - o Parishioners from all three founding parishes
 - o Parishioners from a sampling of supporting parishes
 - Student Voices Coordinator
 - Eucharistic Ministers
 - Coaches
 - Parent volunteers (lunchroom, classroom, recess, office, committee members, other)
- Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, Challenges exercise across constituent groups
- Parental input through two historical surveys
- Parent survey (through Diocese)
- A comprehensive series of committee meetings reviewing data and identifying, developing and analyzing planning elements
- Individual and group meetings with staff members and teachers
- Individual appointments with the Principal and founding Pastors

The planning process began with mission. The founding mission was reviewed and affirmed as the foundation on which the school was built. A new strategic mission was written by the committee as a forward-looking mission statement. The strategic mission is written in the hope it can be memorized by staff, teachers, and students and integrated into the future planning and implementation of the strategic plan.

The plan also includes a vision statement describing where we want to be as a school.

The plan is structured with **four** strategic objectives and **sixteen** goals.

This Strategic Plan is developed as a living document with action items and tasks assigned to individuals and committees to implement over the next five years.
